## **RIBBON CUTTING FOR NEW EAST CAMPUS OF DENVER STREET SCHOOL**

Denver, CO – The Denver Street School is pleased to announce the opening of its new East Campus at 1585 Kingston Street, Aurora, CO 80010 in the Aurora First Presbyterian Church building.

Many from the community are expected to join the school's Board of Directors, faculty, staff, and students on Thursday, September 29, 2005 from 3:00 – 5:00 pm for the school's Dedication Celebration and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony with Aurora Chamber of Commerce Members. Several state and local government officials will also be in attendance. This event is open to the public.

The Denver Street School, founded in 1985 in Denver, Colorado, is a faith-based, alternative secondary school serving troubled youth who have dropped out or been expelled. The Denver Street School is dedicated to the belief that a quality education is the most effective means of transforming many disenfranchised members of society into productive citizens. DSS helps students toward self-sufficiency through education and faith.

In addition to this new campus, which opened on August 18, 2005, the school has a west campus located in Lakewood. During the first year, enrollment is expected to reach 30-40 students. Ms. Denise Hurlburt, former vice-principal at the west campus, is the new principal of the East Campus. "We are very excited to be able to open up another campus on the east side of Denver to serve students there that need a place like the street school," says Hurlburt. There are over 30,000 high school aged students in the Aurora school district, and many are in need of an alternative education program.
